Heights Hospital for Animals opened April 1, 2008. The owners are Dr. Clint Duncan and Kathleen Gallagher. You may have met them at one of Houston Heights Association meetings. Both are Texas A&M graduates. Dr. Duncan graduated with a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree in 2000, and Kathleen has a Bachelor of Science degree in Biomedical Science. They met and worked together at the Spring vet practice of Clint's father, Dr. Sheridan Duncan.



Kathleen was the driving force behind locating in the Heights. She has lived in this area for 15 years and has enjoyed every minute of it. A pet-friendly neighborhood and small-town feel are two of many reasons why she decided to move to this area. Although Dr. Duncan currently lives north of town, he quickly fell in love with this area and is working to relocate his family here.

## Garbage Collection Day Changing

Automated garbage pickup day for most of the Houston Heights Association area is changing from Monday to Thursday. Only the area between I-10 and Washington Avenue will remain on Monday. The new service days become effective Monday, June 29, 2009.

In continuing efforts to improve service and maximize taxpayer dollars, the City of Houston Solid Waste Management Department is re-routing large areas in North Houston for Automated Garbage Collection and Yard Trimmings Collection. The purpose of the re-route is to balance routes for more efficient and speedy service. The department expects the change to save \$250,000 annually.

Recycling dates will remain the same, staying on alternate Mondays for most of the HHA service area. Watch for further announcements, as Solid Waste expects to match recycling service and garbage collection days again as part of a comprehensive plan that includes extending curbside recycling to more neighborhoods. Tree Waste and Junk Waste (formerly called Heavy Trash) pickup dates will not be changing, continuing in alternate months.

The Solid Waste Department thanks everybody for your assistance in this transition. Please remind your neighbors if you don't see their garbage carts out on the new service day.

The department prepared and mailed information to homes in North Houston who will have a new service day. You may also view the "North Re-Route" page on their website and review the service days in your area: <http://www.houstontx.gov/solidwaste/northreroute.html> Only areas detailed on this map were affected by the change of schedule.

### Super Neighborhood Council 15 Notes

The Greater Heights Super Neighborhood Council (GHSNC or SNC15) has been re-formed by a group of area civic organizations, including the Houston Heights Association. The Council meets at 6:30 PM on the third Tuesday of the month at the Fire Station. HHA's delegate Mark Williamson (*your editor*) has been elected President of the Council.

The early meetings of GHSNC were mostly concerned with organizational matters, exchange of information among the member organizations, and learning how a Super Neighborhood Council can work with various levels of government. The June meeting focus was on resources and tactics available to deal with crime in the Greater Heights area. The Council will discuss future directions in July.

Super Neighborhoods were created to encourage residents of neighboring communities to work together to identify, prioritize, and address the needs and concerns of the broader community. Super Neighborhood Councils are one way that City Departments and City Council can work more effectively with neighborhoods, be responsive to communities, and deliver city services and needed improvements promptly and courteously. ## From the June PIP meeting:

Effective July 1, 2009, the Heights Storefront will be open from 7 AM until 8 PM, Monday - Friday. The Heights Storefront is located at 1127 North Shepherd. The Ana Maria Lopez Storefront, located at 1050 Quitman in the Carnegie Library, will be open 8 AM until 4 PM, Monday - Friday. The Lopez Storefront will be staffed with a Police Service Officer.

A traffic control officer has been assigned to address citizen complaints that drivers are disregarding the bicycle lanes on Heights Boulevard, endangering bicyclists that use these lanes. The officer will address this matter utilizing education as well as enforcement if he finds that this is a problem. He has also been asked to evaluate the signage and the lane striping to ensure that drivers can adequately see the bicycle lanes.

As safety is their goal, HPD asks that as you drive in your neighborhood, you be aware of these lanes and the bicyclists that use them. If you are a bike rider, please be aware that there are also laws that govern your movements.
