## Education Grants Announced

Nine proposals from teachers at schools in the Heights have been accepted for funding by the Houston Heights Education Committee. Checks will be presented at the January 9 General Meeting.

Stephanie Witherspoon's students in the Robotics program at Hamilton Middle School will soon have five new robots so that small groups can solve a student-generated challenge.

Sharon Sipps, physical education teacher at Harvard, is planning a Fun Food Festival where students from area elementary schools will not only learn how to make (and eat) healthy snacks but will also learn tips on living a healthy life style. Ann Margaret Ellis, Harvard's Magnet Science Lab teacher, will enhance her school-wide recycling program, and third grade G/T teacher Christine McKnight will use her grant to enhance the science curriculum for Harvard's third grade. New software in the Magnet Math Lab will turn Iva Huff's students into master Jeopardy players as they perfect their math skills.

At Helms Community Learning Center, Science Lab teacher Lindy Meador will obtain recording equipment to allow her science students to record their classes and experiments in a school-wide gardening project. The student-generated videos will be circulated and shared.

Zalena Bassin, second grade ESL teacher at the Heights Learning Academy, will add a computer to her classroom and Denise Johnson who teaches math and science for students in grades 3 through 5 at the Academy will acquire a document camera. This equipment will enhance curriculum and enhance technical skills.

The January Houston Heights Restoration/Historical Committee Meeting will be held on Thursday, January 19, from 7:30 to 9:30 PM at 3423 White Oak Drive. This is the artist gallery of “Raku” ceramics artist Margarete Sanchez-Ripps, located in a one-story 1920’s Craftsman Bungalow building. The building has been totally restored over a two-year period with much work from the Craftsman columns on the front porch to major work on the interior rooms and floors and modest kitchen. This gallery, named The Artful Corner, features an exciting collection of one-of-a-kind fine American crafts and gifts. During restoration, several interesting things were found in the walls and under the old structure.

This very special meeting will be enjoyed by those in the neighborhood interested in detailed restoration of a bungalow-style property. Meeting attendees should bring photos of this structure, if they have any, and restoration questions and thoughts as to how they might preserve their property in the best way possible.

## Heights Trivia — Peace and Order in Houston Heights

Some of the responsibilities placed on the officials of the City of Houston Heights by the 1896 charter:

“To prohibit and restrain or regulate the rolling of hoops, the flying of kites and firing of fire crackers, the use of velocipedes and bicycles, and the use of any pyrotechnics or any other amusements or practices tending to annoy persons passing in the streets or sidewalks, or to frighten horses or teams.

“To restrain and prohibit the ringing of bells or blowing of horns, bugles and whistles, crying of goods and all other noises, practices and performances tending to the collection of persons in the streets or sidewalks by auctioneers and others for the purpose of business, amusement or otherwise.

“To regulate and control the driving of cattle, horses and all other animals into or through the city.

“To prevent and punish the keepers of houses in which loud or immoral theatrical representations are given, and to adopt summary measures for the removal or suppression of all such establishments.

“To prohibit, prevent and suppress horse racing, immoderate riding and driving in the streets of said city.”

## Summary of November Board Meeting

The HHA Board met at the Heights Fire Station at 6:30 PM on November 21, 2005. Included in this meeting were incoming Board members. Paul Carr asked the Board if consideration had been given to the proposed new fundraiser, the Heights Bicycle Rally. Treasurer Lee Gaskill gave the financial report. Kathy Butler updated the Board regarding Donovan Park. Tiles have been repaired and new lighting installed. Pamela Kunkemoeller will chair the Donovan Park Committee. A request for volunteers will be published in the newsletter.

Robin Franklin wants input regarding the handling of public relations for HHA events. A report is given on the Heights Festival. The attendance of the Festival has changed. The manpower and money it takes to put on the Festival has increased over the years making the fundraiser less profitable. There are more restrictions placed on HHA by the City to put on the parade. A vote was taken, and there will not be a Heights Festival in 2006.

The Deed Restriction Committee has a new chair, Kathy Butler. Karen Derr asked the Board to consider splitting into two organizations: an organization for preservation and an organization for civic matters. A split might encourage more participation by some Heights residents who feel that new development is being monitored too closely. The Vision and Mission Statement of HHA adopted in 1993 includes both preservation and civic matters. Though new development is encouraged, so is the desire to preserve the integrity of the Houston Heights as a diverse, small-town community in the heart of Houston where neighbors and businesses thrive, children learn and play, and history lives.

Discussion on 1414 Ashland and the Holiday Home Tour. Gonzalo Camacho resigned from the Board, and Sheila Sorvari was officially voted in as his replacement. The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 PM.

## Organizational Meeting and Orientation

Two special meetings in January will be of particular interest to new Directors, Officers, and Chairs.

At the January 5 Organizational Meeting, the 2006 Board will elect officers, set meeting dates, and assign check-signing authority. This meeting will be in the Board Room at 6:30 PM.

The January 22 Orientation Session will provide both new and continuing Directors, Officers, and Chairs with information about Association policies, procedures, committees, events, projects, business matters, and related topics. This session will start at 1:00 PM in the large meeting room and should be over by 4:00 PM.

## Heights Bicycle & Skate Rally

Rally Date: Sunday, October 15, 8:00 AM - 5:00 PM.

Start & Finish: Heights Fire Station, 12th & Yale St. Participants will pedal, ride, or skate a 15-mile route through the Heights, Montrose, the Museum District, Downtown Houston, 6th Ward, and Woodland Heights. Each participant will be issued a map of the route and a rally card. At each of five (5) checkpoints, the rally riders and skaters will have their rally card punched, and they will receive a sealed envelope that contains a playing card. At the end of the ride, the envelopes will be opened by a rally judge.

Prizes: Best Hand - \$2,000, 2nd Best - \$1,000, 3rd - \$500.

Merchandise prizes will be awarded by drawing from a container of the rally cards of everyone who completes the course.

Entry Fee: \$20.00 (No Refunds & No Rain Date)

Eligibility: Bicycle riders, roller skaters, and children in bike seats, tag-a-longs, or trailers.

Rules:

1. All participants must finish the course by 5:00 PM, Oct. 15.
2. To qualify for cash prizes, playing card envelopes must be opened and posted by a rally judge. Any envelopes that show signs of tampering will be disqualified.

Proceeds: All proceeds of the rally go to the Houston Heights Association Boulevard Beautification Fund.

A committee is meeting monthly to work out the details of the rally and how to promote it. The event will require many volunteers. Volunteering for one of the rally jobs will not preclude participating in the event.
